Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

1) How do I find out about events and workshops?

Workshop and event schedules will be updated regularly on <u>www.accessprogram.com</u>.
 Make sure to check back often to see what's coming up.

2) There are never any tickets available when I look for them.

Event tickets are typically released on www.accessprogram.ca shortly before the event date and are first come first served. However, in order to ensure every participant has the opportunity to meet their event requirements, those who have not already attended an event may be given priority.

3) How do I prepare for a Connector Meeting?

- Once you have received your Connector's contact information, contact them and politely ask to schedule your 45 60 minute interview.
- Although the Connector meetings are meant to be casual and friendly, you should always
 conduct yourself in a professional manner. Make sure to dress appropriately for an office
 environment, and consider ahead of time what questions you would like to ask your
 Connector. Don't forget to bring the Connector Interview Template to help guide the
 conversation.
- At the conclusion of the meeting, politely ask for contact information for two referrals.

4) How am I assigned a Connector?

Access Program staff have taken care to match you with the best available Connector for your interests and/or field of study. However, it is important to remember there are a limited number of Connectors, and there may not always be a perfect match available. Please be assured that every Connector is an experienced and respected professional in their field, and they will all offer valuable insights. Plus additional referrals will always present new opportunities for different perspectives and areas of expertise.

5) What should I do if I can't contact my Connector?

- If after several attempts you are unable to contact your assigned Connector through the contact information you are given, please contact staff at admin@bbot.ca or 604-412-0100 for assistance.















6) What if my Connector doesn't give me a referral?

- If for some reason your Connector is unable to give you two referrals, please contact staff at admin@bbot.ca or 604-412-0100 for assistance.

7) What if I can't meet the minimum requirements of the program?

- Participants are required to complete the minimum requirements outlined in the Requirements Checklist in order to successfully complete the program. If you are concerned about you ability to complete all the requirements for reasons outside of your control, contact staff at admin@bbot.ca or 604-412-0100 and we will work with you to try to address the issue.
